Please make sure you have downloaded the Reach More Parents app . This is essential for school to home communication as individual letters and notes are sent directly to you using this app. If you have never downloaded this , please contact Mrs Richards for your child's code.

Smallest things making the difference to a comfortable start.

At the start of the year, it's easy to forget the little things that can make big differences for children in school . The following advice may be useful for consideration while adults manage the bigger parts of starting the school year.

- Please ensure your child has a water bottle , labelled with their name.
- Jumpers , lunchboxes and coats can be easily lost - please write names on all uniform and belongings to help us reunite lost items.
- PE kits can stay in school over the half term to ensure they are not forgotten
- A bag big enough for homework books, reading books and a separate pocket for water bottles ,which can leak, can be very helpful for children to be organised.
- Fruit is provided for children in EYFS and KS1 for break snack, from year 3 onwards, please provide a healthy , nut free snack for tuck.
- Please remind children what they have ordered for lunch each day to avoid confusion.
- Speak to your child's teacher should you have any worries or concerns. They are your first port of call and are always happy to help .
- Reassure your little one they they can always talk to their trusted adults in school if they need anything throughout the day.



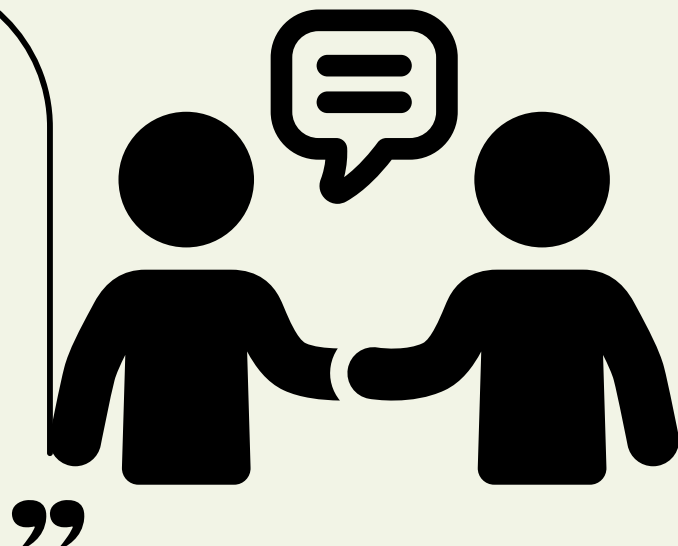
Friends of Leighswood PTA

Medical needs and Contact information

If your child has any medical needs , or requires regular medication , it is important we have this on our files along with your GP contact details as well as your own emergency contact details.

Trained staff are able to administer medication to children who need this in the school day. This has to be a prescribed medication from a GP with the original box or packaging naming the medication and dosage for your child. Please complete a form with the admin team should your child need medication during school time.

For children with asthma or severe allergies, inhalers and epipens should be brought into the school office on the first day with the asthma or allergy plan provided by the nursing team. This medication and plan will remain in your child's class and will be carried with your child at all times in a classroom medical box

When any medication is administered, you will receive an email notification through our medical tracker app. Please do ensure we have your contact details to date for this purpose.

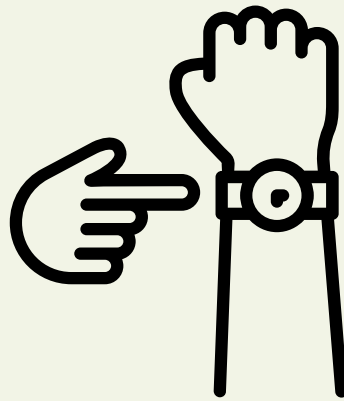
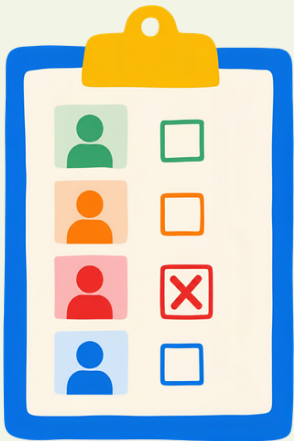
If your child needs a medical care plan, please arrange a time to meet with Mr Thompson who will be happy to create a medical care plan with you for your child. Mr Thompson will also be reaching out to existing families to update existing care plans .

Please make sure we have your most up to date contact information including your home address, mobile number and at least one other alternative contact we can phone should we need to contact you during the school day.



School attendance ,punctuality and holiday requests.



In July 2026 , the DFE issued further guidance to schools to strengthen the commitment to raising school attendance and punctuality. As a school , we are unable to authorise school leave of absence unless for extraordinary circumstances. If you feel that you would like to ask for a school leave of absence , please come to the office to complete the approved request form for this to be considered. Approval can be granted for religious observance , hospital and medical appointments and educational participation such as musical examinations or national , county or club sports activities with a form of evidence.

As a school, we take attendance seriously as we know the impact missing days from learning and friends can have .

If your child is not able to attend school , it is important to call school between 8.30 and 8.45 to register your child's absence. If school do not hear from you, we will call you directly each day and may conduct home visits if your child is away for more than three days.

If you do require any support with your child's attendance or are struggling with accessing transport, we may be able to help. Please contact Mr Craig Thompson at school via the office to see how we can help.

At Leighswood , our school day begins at 8.45 and gates close at 8.55. If arriving late, please bring your child to the office and sign them into school with the reason for lateness to register their attendance. Miss McGrath or Mrs Richards will then be happy to then escort them to class.
